healthy shamrock shake

1 frozen large banana, over-ripe
cacao nibs or chocolate chips
1/8 tsp to 1/4 tsp pure peppermint
extract (I like 1/4 tsp)
2/3 cup to 1 cup milk of choice
(For a super-rich shake, try full-fat canned coconut milk)
optional: 1/4 cup frozen spinach
(If you can't get on board with
the greens-in-smoothies thing,
you can opt for green food
coloring or just drink a white mint
shake. Or add a pinch of
spirulina!)

Blend all ingredients in a blender until completely smooth. Make sure the banana you use is at least somewhat brown, so you don't get that unripe earthy banana flavor in your mint chocolate shake! You can add the chocolate either before or after blending.
