Frozen Bubbles Experiment

Directions:

- 1) Go outside when the temperatures are below freezing 32 degrees F.
 - 2) Allow your bubble solution to cool before blowing bubbles.
 - 3) Find a place outside that is cold and protected from the wind.
 - 4) Blow a bubble and catch it on the bubble wand.
 - 5) Wait. The bubble won't free immediately. Depending on the temperature outside, it may take a few seconds to a few minutes to freeze.
- 6) When the bubble is frozen. touch it lightly and see what happens.

HOT COCOA





- 3 tablespoons cocoa powder (preferably Dutch-processed), plus more for serving
- 3 cups whole milk
- 6 ounces semisweet chocolate (preferably Scharffen Berger), finely chopped
- 3 tablespoons demerara or granulated sugar
- Lightly sweetened whipped cream (for serving)

Preparation

Bring 3/4 cup water to a simmer in a medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Whisk in 3 Tbsp. cocoa powder until no lumps remain, then add milk and return to a simmer. Whisk in chocolate and sugar and cook, whisking frequently, until mixture is smooth and creamy and chocolate is melted, about 5 minutes.

Divide hot chocolate among mugs. Top with whipped cream and dust with cocoa powder.
