#### WINTER JACKETS AND CAR SEAT SAFETY

As we're going through our coldest and snowiest season of the wonderful Minnesota weather it's important to keep our children safe and warm inside their car seats. The biggest way we can keep them safe is to NOT put a thick and bulky jacket on them before strapping them into their car seat. If your child is wearing a thick jacket it can result in the harness being too loose so it may not be effective if there were to be a crash or accident. A few ideas of things you could do to still keep them warm in the car are: 1) after securing your child in their car seat, turn their jacket around so their arms will still go in the arm sleeves and keep them warm 2) after securing your child in their car seat, cover them up with a blanket. Of course our hopes are that there would never be any sort of accident but it's important to have good car safety for everyone and to do whatever we can to keep the precious little



### KITCHEN HELPERS

Does your child love to help in the kitchen? Check out these age appropriate tasks they can help with:



2 Year Olds: scrub, wash & clean vegetables and fruit, carry unbreakable items to the table, wash and tear lettuce & salad greens, and break bread into pieces

**3 Year Olds:** pour pre-measured liquids into batter, knead dough, mix dry ingredients, spread butters or spreads, serve food, clear table, and care for trash

**4 Year Olds:** peel, mash, scrub fruit and vegetables, crack open/beat eggs, cut soft foods with plastic knife, set and clear table, measure dry ingredients, clean up after cooking
