Glimpse into our Teaching Style


The 8 areas of development we focus on: Approaches to learning; social and emotional development; physical development and health; language; literacy and communication; mathematics; creative arts; science and technology; and social studies.

Each month our newsletter will feature one of the 8 areas of development in more detail. This month we will focus on – Approaches to Learning.

What Falls into the Approaches to Learning Category?

- 1) Initiative: Children demonstrate initiative as they explore their world.
- 2) **Planning:** Children make plans and follow through on their intentions.
 - 3) **Engagement:** Children focus on activities that interest them.
 - 4) **Problem Solving:** Children solve problems encountered in play.
- 5) Use of Resources: Children gather information and formulate ideas about their world.

Adult's role in supporting active learning: organizing environments, organizing routines, establishing a supportive social climate, encouraging children's intentional actions, problem solving, and verbal reflections, interpreting children's actions in terms of curriculum content, and planning experiences.


