Toddler 1

We can't believe it's already July and the year is half over! We have a busy month planned with so many fun things to do, see, play, and learn. We love to play and interact with the children and get down to their level to see things through their eyes. It's amazing!

Did you Know?

We have been working hard on potty training on a daily basis and the children are doing well.

We are in amazement watching your children go through the different stages of development. Some interesting levels of development that we wanted to share with you:

<u>Precontrol level(beginner)</u> – children at this level cannot consciously control or intentionally replicate a movement except under limited conditions <u>Control level (advanced beginner)</u> – children's movement at this level are less haphazard as their bodies begin to respond more fluidly to their intentions.

<u>Utilization level (intermediate)</u> – Children at this level are capable of an increasing range of automatic movements. They no longer pause to "think" before joining in more complex actions like climbing a jungle gym.

<u>Proficiency level(advanced)</u> – Children's basic movements become more automatic and at this level their movements begin to seem effortless.

Preschool 1

Happy July! We are ready to dive into a fun filled month with new games, worksheets, activities, and of course, excitement! Our curriculum offers a lot of learning time with a twist of fun for engaging daily education. We are excited to have a new Smart Board in the Preschool Rooms for learning games. We are still following our weekly curriculum but allowing more free play and time to enjoy the beautiful weather. Each day is new and exciting and we have a lot to learn and play!

Did you Know?

We have been focusing on gross-motor skills lately! These skills help the children demonstrate strength, flexibility, balance, and timing in using their large muscles. The preschoolers develop different skills over time and it's amazing for us to watch them grow and develop these skills.

Non-locomotor movements are stationary movements like twisting, bending, rocking, etc)

<u>Locomotor</u> movements are traveling movements like running, galloping, marching, etc).

The children then learn to coordinate and combine these movements to do things such as throwing, catching, kicking, bouncing balls, and using a swing.
